And again to repeat that all interested parishioners and their groups are reminded of the decision of the Parish Council taken at its July meeting that requests for financial support must be made by the December meeting at the very latest in order to be considered for support in the next financial year, ie. 1st April onwards.

Letter from the Rector

Will we ever learn from history ...?

Dear friends,,

It was Winston Churchill who said in 1948 that "Those that fail to learn from history are doomed to repeat it".

Having lived and fought during the Great War, Churchill was aware of how the seeds of the Second World War had been sown by the failure to learn from what had gone so badly wrong in events leading up to the First World War. And how the way in which Germany had been treated in defeat after the Great War had facilitated the rise of Adolf Hitler and the evil of Nazism.

Since Vladimir Putin launched his invasion of Ukraine in 2022, comparisons have been drawn with the aggressive war waged by Hitler and Nazi Germany.

It is ironic that those who claim to be motivated by anti-colonialism are those who in turn seek to colonise other nations. And how individual leaders like Hitler and Putin often seem to be driven by fear, resentment and anger.

Tragically when such leaders are able to manipulate and control their nation to collude with a warped world view, then major international conflict is almost inevitable.

Similar comparisons could be drawn with the situation in the Middle East today - one where historical grievances and conflicting ideologies have led to an escalation of violent conflict across the whole region.

During this month, we remember the cost of sin-spoiled human history - how humankind seems doomed to repeat itself in destructive cycles of violent behaviour. We know that this can be true at the individual level - for example, how dysfunctional relationships within families are handed down the generations.

It is also true at a national and international level when ideological fanaticism - religious or secular - drives people to commit evil acts in the name of their cause. And - as we recall on Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday - such evil can only be stopped at great cost.

Is there any hope, then, in the face of human folly? Christians believe that there is, but that this hope also came at great cost. In Jesus Christ, God has proclaimed that things can change - that lives really can be set free from the shackles and sins of the past.

Yet this path to freedom and peace led Jesus to the cruel and unjust shame and suffering of death on a Roman cross. Yet His story didn't end there - Jesus was raised to new life at Easter, proclaiming His once-and-for-all victory over sin and death.

In the light of Jesus Christ, there is indeed hope for us and this world. The light of God's Kingdom has already dawned, and the future need no longer be determined by the past. Through Jesus Christ, God opens the way from despair to hope, from darkness to light, from death to life.

And God also invites us to share in the outworking of His-story - the coming of His Kingdom which is the healing of creation. But are we willing to do so?


